

Troop 16 Leadership Position Description

JUNIOR ASSISTANT SCOUTMASTER

GENERAL INFORMATION

Type: Appointed by the Scoutmaster

Term: 1 year **Reports to:** Scoutmaster

Description: The Junior Assistant Scoutmaster serves in the capacity of an Assistant Scoutmaster except where

legal age and maturity are required. He must be at least 16 years old and not yet 18. He's appointed

by the Scoutmaster because of his leadership ability.

Comments: In many cases the JASM has the same responsibilities as an Assistant Scoutmaster.

QUALIFICATIONS

Age: At least 16 years old

Rank: Life or higher

Experience: Previous service SPL/ASPL or Eagle Scout

Attendance: 75% over the previous 6 months

PERFORMANCE REQUIREMENTS

Training: You <u>must</u> attend the troop Junior Leader Training even if you have attended in the past.

Attendance: You are expected to attend 80% of all troop meetings, Patrol Leaders' Council meetings, outings, and

service projects.

Effort: You are expected to give this job your best effort.

GENERAL LEADERSHIP RESPONSIBILITIES

Uniform: Set the example by wearing your uniform correctly. This means that you will wear all of the parts of

the troop uniform, shirttail tucked in, with all required badges in their correct locations.

Behavior: Set the example by living the Scout Oath and Law in your everyday life. Show Scout Spirit in

everything you say and do.

Attendance: Set the example by being an active Scout. Be on-time for meetings and activities. You must call the

Senior Patrol Leader or Scoutmaster if you are not going to be at a meeting or if you suddenly have to miss an outing. You also need to make sure that someone will assume your responsibilities.

SPECIFIC LEADERSHIP RESPONSIBILITIES

Functions as an Assistant Scoutmaster.

Works very close with the SPL due to his past experience.

Performs duties as assigned by the Scoutmaster.

Serves as a member of the Patrol Leader's Council.
